GENERAL TIPS

Headshots

- Your headshot needs to be up to date. We cannot stress enough how important it is to have a headshot that accurately portrays how you currently look.
- Headshots should be in color and if possible, they should professionally duplicated 8x10s, rather than printed on regular computer or photo paper.
- We recommend that you have at least one business/corporate shot and one commercial shot.

Resumes

- Resumes should be clear and concise. See our sample resume on our website. (<u>https://carlyndaviscasting.com/wp-content/uploads/2019/12/Sample-Resume.doc</u>) If you have teleprompter or ear prompter experience, we recommend listing this **in bold** at the top of your resume. This is an extremely useful skill to have in this area. If you do not have teleprompter or ear prompter experience, we recommend getting into a class that teaches these skills as soon as possible.
- Generally, it is not a good idea to list extra work on your resume, even if you only have a few on camera credits. It is better to list a couple legitimate credits rather than a long list of extra work.
- Special skills should list only skills in which you excel.
- Always attach your resume to the back of your headshot. Resumes should be trimmed to fit your 8X10 headshot. We recommend stapling or printing to insure that your headshot and resume do not get separated. This should all be done BEFORE you attend any audition.
- Training is an important part of your resume, especially if you do not have many credits. In particular, if you do not have on camera experience, we recommend that you take on camera training courses.

Demo Reels

- Demo reels are important tools for your career. You should try and collect samples of your on camera work whenever possible. If we send you to a shoot and you would like a copy, it is your responsibility to obtain one. Please keep in mind that the client is not obligated to give you a copy.
- If you want work in voiceovers, it is essential to have a voiceover demo. If you do not have voice over experience, there are studios/voiceover coaches that will record tracks of your voice, from which they can create a voiceover demo for you. See our service recommendations for a listing.
